

YCAN Programs

Yarmouth Cares About Neighbors (YCAN) is an all-volunteer group of community-minded Yarmouth residents who provide support services to community members in need. Residents who do not have the means to purchase fuel needed to warm their homes during the winter, or sufficient food and clothing for their family, or for other critical needs, can find assistance from a number of programs that YCAN supports.

YCAN is registered as a 501(c)(3) non-profit. Our areas of focus include:

FUEL ASSISTANCE

YCAN provides funding for Fuel Assistance and home weatherization awards to Yarmouth residents, and sets the policies used to disburse them. The Town of Freeport General Assistance Office manages all General Assistance services to Yarmouth residents.

This fund helps around 35 Yarmouth households each year.

FOOD PANTRY

YCAN provides bookkeeping support, helps build awareness of, and raises funds for the Yarmouth Community Food Pantry.

Housed at the First Parish Congregational Church on Main Street, the Food Pantry helps about 75 families (200+ people) per month. It also offers qualifying adults \$15 vouchers towards food at the Yarmouth Farmers' Market.

NUTRITION CLOSET

School Guidance/Social Work staff provide weekend nutrition for students with unstable access to food at home during the school year.

LUNCH CRUNCH

YCAN and Yarmouth Community Services address summer food insecurity by serving a free breakfast and lunch during the summer at Yarmouth Pointe Apartments. Open to all children between the ages of 2-18, it's also a free camp experience!

THE RIDES PROGRAM

Volunteer drivers provide free rides to those who cannot drive and need rides to local events, medical appointments, or errands.

During 2016, 25 volunteer drivers donated 705 hours to help residents get where they needed to go, many of them weekly.

RESOURCE GUIDE

The YCAN Resource Guide lists the service providers, funding agencies, churches, and others who are most likely to be useful to residents needing help, or who wish to help out in and around Yarmouth. It can be downloaded from our web site, or found in Merrill Library or Town Hall.

AGING IN PLACE

Volunteers are implementing the plan to develop programs for transportation, accessibility, social opportunities, volunteerism, health services, economic security, communication & coordination of services, and housing options. All are welcome to help create and/or utilize these services.

PROJECT HOLIDAY

Many Yarmouth residents, businesses, and civic organizations support this program. It provides Yarmouth families in need with meals and gifts for their children during the Holidays. YCAN helps with distribution and coordination.

During the 2016 holidays, this effort helped about 250 people with holiday meal fixings, and provided gifts for around 100 children.

OPERATION BUNDLE-UP

Volunteers collect gently used or outgrown winter outerwear, inspect and clean them, and distribute them to those in need.

Around 200 coats, 15 pairs of boots, and 80 additional warm clothing items find new homes through this program each year.

COMMUNITY CENTER

With support from YCAN, a steering committee is researching possible roles and locations for a Yarmouth Community Center.

FUNDRAISING

The Yarmouth Cares Fund is an annual YCAN campaign which typically raises over \$35,000 in financial support for many of the programs with which we are affiliated.

In recent years, funds raised have supported **Fuel Assistance**, the **Yarmouth Community Food Pantry**, **Lunch Crunch**, the **Nutrition Closet**, **Project Holiday**, **Aging in Place**, Farmer's Market vouchers (available at 317 Main St & Food Pantry), and other efforts to meet Yarmouth needs.
